Maharaja Ganga Singhji Trust was created by Late Maharaja Dr. Karni Singhji of Bikaner in 1972 for public charitable and philanthropic purposes, to promote the development of the former Bikaner State with a view to promote cultural, educational, medical, and sports facilities.

During the course of year 2010 the major projects undertaken were: -

Exhibition of Sudhir Kasliwal's photographs of his visit to China and the Far East in January 2010 at Sri Sadul Museum:

Started as a hobby during his school days, photography turned into a consuming passion for Sudhir Kasliwal of the famous house of jewellers Gem Palace in Jaipur.

Sudhir Kasliwal's photographs are people oriented. His forte is capturing piquant situations – A camel groaning under the collective weight of a score of scrambling villagers, a tree sprouting colourful turbans of villages attempting to get a view of a sporting event. These

expeditions have yielded some of the best studies of numerous lesser known tribes of Rajasthan such as the Bhils, the Garasiyas and the Gadia Luhars. A skillful use of natural light is another strong feature of his photography.

The exhibition was opened on the 9th January 2010 to visitors. Over a thousand people have visited this exhibition during 2010. The exhibition was a great success and the same was reported in various newspapers.


Donations by the Trust

Up gradation of Sajjan Niwas Wing

The whole of the Sajjan Niwas wing was taken up for renovation. The rooms are now provided with wooden flooring, modern bathroom with shower cubical, separate dressing room, LCD TV, satellite TV fed, mini bar etc. The rooms are appreciated by the guests staying in them as well as the travel agents and have added to the image and value of the hotel greatly.

Installation of Solar Heating System

Sri Sadul Museum has been open since 1976 and was located on the upper floor of Sadul Niwas wing of Lallgarh Palace. Some years ago the trustees made a decision to shift the museum to a purpose made new building where all the artifacts could be displayed more appropriately. The artifacts were shifted to the new building and museum was opened to the public from 1st October 2008. Since then the Museum has been functioning from this new building and a large numbers of visitors are coming to see the museum daily and is appreciated by the visitors.

Encouraged by the response to the exhibition of photographs by Sudhir Kasliwal, the management has decided to hold running exhibition every year. During the year 2011 exhibition titled "Fort & Palaces of Bikaner through Art" will be held. Oil and water colour paintings of Bikaner Fort and Palaces by different artists and also old photographs will be on display for public viewing. The exhibition will be on from mid January to end of Dec. 2011.
